- A complete, notarized application
- Current passport-style photograph of yourself
- Copy of your Mississippi Board of Nursing Final Order
- Five (5) notarized affidavits, completed by three (3) licensed individuals and two (2) laypersons
- If applicable, verification of licensure in another jurisdiction
- Proof of completion of education courses (e.g., certificates of completion, or listings from continuing education providers)
- If applicable, assessment conducted/ submitted by Board-approved assessor
- If currently or previously under criminal probation, non-adjudication, drug court, or similar legal supervision, copies of all legal agreements and documentation verifying completion of all terms, including payment of fines and final disposition of the case, etc.
- Documentation of a minimum of twelve (12) consecutive months of normal, negative drug screens immediately preceding submission of the Restoration Application
- Documentation of a minimum of twelve (12) consecutive months of AA/NA meeting attendance immediately preceding submission of the Restoration Application, recorded on Board-approved calendars with chairperson signatures or accompanied by online meeting verification
- If applicable, aftercare reports for a minimum of twelve (12) months
- If applicable, signed Authorization(s) to Release treatment records and copies of said records

The Board of Nursing may restore a license ONLY if the applicant can present compelling evidence to the Board of Nursing that his or her license should be restored in the face of misconduct that resulted in the loss of licensure. While the Board of Nursing has the authority to restore a nursing license, such restoration is not a RIGHT, and the burden of proof is on the Applicant.
