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The following meeting was held at the Mississippi Board of Nursing, 713 South Pear Orchard Road, Plaza II, Suite 300, in the City of Ridgeland, State of Mississippi, on Friday, October 12, 2018, commencing at approximately 11:09 a.m.

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DR. KING: We will go ahead and go on the record on October 12th, 2018, at 11:09 a.m., and I'm going to ask Ms. Jan Collins to open us up with a word of prayer.

MS. COLLINS: Good morning to everybody. Will y'all please bow your heads and pray with me.

(PRAYER)

DR. KING: So we do have a quorum today. Let the record show that Dr. Michelle Owens is not present for today's meeting. The next thing on the agenda is actually the approval of the agenda, but we need to add one item to that, and that would be the addition of the Colby Amis case be added for conclusion of deliberations per the hearing panel that was included in that case.

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We are honored to have the Board of
Nursing joining us on Thursday for our session

dedicated to RNs and Friday for our session dedicated

to APRNs. She also expresses appreciation to everyone
that participated in the MNA PAC's Fundraiser for

Representative Donnie Scoggin. As always, Teresa

extends a standing invitation to anyone with questions
and concerns to her.

Anyone else? Okay. That takes us to the Office of Nursing Workforce.

MS. JONES: Good morning. Over the last five weeks, I've had the opportunity to work closely with the ONW Committee and the chair, Ms. Darlene Lindsey, and I appreciate their help in helping me with the transition. And I've made it a point to incorporate the five interdependent components of ONW with all of the projects that are slated for the Fiscal Year 2019, and I'm excited, and I am looking

forward to the projects to come to fruition. So, over the last five weeks, it has been busy but productive, and the following is an update for ONW:

The Career Fair took place on September 6th, 2018, at the Marriott Hotel. The goal of this Career Fair was to bring together a diverse group of healthcare employees and schools of nursing persons in order for those that are actively looking for employment and for enrollment in schools of nursing. We had a total of 14 vendors to take part in the Career Fair: six schools of nursing, two hospitals, three nursing organizations, American Red Cross, and Magnolia Health. The Career Fair was well received by the vendors, and they would like to see us to continue with the Career Fairs.

ONW Scholarships: The Office of Nursing Workforce Budget has a line item of \$800,000 for scholarships. On September the 7th, the application was uploaded to the Mississippi Board of Nursing website, and we also emailed all the deans and directors for the schools of nursing to inform them that that scholarship is available. The scholarship application form is due on October 30th, 2018, and the deadline for the submission of the accountability forms and the scholarship recipient forms is June 1st,

2019. As of today, we have 23 applicants for the scholarships.

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On Projects, the first one is Dealing with Clients with Challenging Behavior. The focus of this project is to develop a statewide program to educate nurses regarding Dealing with Clients with Challenging Behaviors, and we are still in the planning process for this, and we are looking at getting facilitators and faculty to conduct the workshops, as well as a needs assessments.

Telehealth is to be announced. However, the goal of this is to incorporate the telehealth components in the majority of the ONW projects.

The Substance Use Disorder: The focus of this project is to develop a statewide program to enhance nurses -- to educate nurses regarding Substance Use Disorder in the healthcare workplace. The workshop will be modeled after the workshop that the National Council of State Boards of Nursing conducts.

The LPN Faculty Simulation: The focus of this project is to provide the LPN faculty the opportunity to attend workshops or a series of workshops, simulation-based education. The workshops will be sponsored by ONW with no charge to the

educational program directed towards nursing educators regulating healthcare delivery system, and we will partner with the University of Mississippi Medical Center, and CEUs will be offered. An email was sent to all of the deans and directors informing them of this faculty simulation. As of October 7th, we have 96 plus commitments for LPNs that would like to participate in that workshop.

The Data Project: The system design and programming is complete. Blue Consulting Group is working to get the data to link together, and on October 15th we will have a formal demo for the Data Project. We will get weekly updates on this project, and that started as of last Friday. So, each Friday we will get an update as far as where we are on the timeline for that particular project. We are targeted to go live and have all of our data inputted in on October 31st, and that concludes my report.

DR. KING: Thank you, Tywanda. I want to tell you that, on behalf of the entire board, we really appreciate the work that you have put into this and working diligently, because I know it has not been an easy task. So we appreciate you.

KING: Motion passes. Agreed 9 settlement proposals are going to be December 4th, 10 2018. Disciplinary hearings are December 5th and 6th, 11 2018, beginning at 8:30 a.m. The panel for this is 12 Ms. Darlene Lindsey, Dr. Teresa Stanford, Ms. Nancy 13 Norris, and Ms. Sandra Culpepper. Our business 14 meeting will be held on December 7th, 2018, beginning 15 at 11:05 a.m. And that brings us to a legislative 16 17 update. MS. JOHNSON: Good morning. No, I'm not 18 Trey Bobinger. However, Trey regretfully could not be 19 with us today, but he did send his report. 20 provided a report. It was emailed to you, and it 21 should be in your packet as well. So I will 22 highlight, because he gave an overview of what we have 2.3 done over the past year and also gave some 24 consideration for the upcoming legislative session.

So I wanted to really just high point those issues, unless you have questions about what we have done over the past year in legislation.

One of those is the full practice
authority. We, the Board, continue to support nurses
practicing to the full extent of their education and
training. And so we will be making sure that we
partner and assist those entities, the coalition that
will be going forward to look at the issues dealing
with full practice authority, and that includes MNA,
MANP, and MANA, as well as the National Council of
State Boards of Nursing.

The second one that we're looking at considering for the legislative session this legislative session is the MAP Program, which is our Monitoring Alternative Program. We discussed and explored the idea of drafting and having legislation introduced in this session which would allow a viable alternative to outright license suspension in limited situations where the licensee is battling drug addiction. The goal of the legislation would be to help those licensees who are truly fighting addiction but also protect the patients by providing the Board the discretion and means to place restrictions and oversight on such licensees. And several other states

have already enacted similar legislation. So we will be looking at that during this session.

The third item is the Dialysis

Technicians. There has been some discussion with the Governor's Office at their request regarding the licensing of CCHTs which is currently being done by the Board. They are interested in opening the possibility of transferring the current licensing process from the Board of Nursing entity. To be clear, this issue is still in the preliminary stages of discussion, and no final decisions have been made. The Mississippi Department of Health currently has some oversight of dialysis centers across the state. So there's more to come on that, but that's one of the issues that they have been talking about.

And the fourth issue -- and, Madam

President, you may want to elaborate on that -- is the

Rural Access Grant. If you would like, you can chime
in on that particular one, but we wanted to include

nurses particularly in that bill as well, as they have
already included physicians and some other entities,
like the dentists and so forth. And we feel like

nurses should also be included in that. So we will be
pursuing that legislation as well. Any questions?

(NO VERBAL RESPONSE)

MS. JOHNSON: Thank you.

DR. KING: Perfect. Thanks, Phyllis.

So, okay, you're up next too, so Executive Director's Report.

MS. JOHNSON: And you have a copy of the Executive Director's Report. While she is setting that up, I do want to also inform you that I provided an annual report from the Board's perspective of what we have done over the past year. You have that in your packet, and it will be available. I think we're going to put it on the website as well, but it's just an annual report.

I did want to highlight a couple of issues with that while she is setting the other one up. One of those would be the licensure aspect. It has a nice picture of all you board members, not in that one, but in the annual report. But I did want to highlight a couple of issues. I broke it down by departments as to our licensure statistics.

As you are aware, over the past year, it involved the renewal process of the LPNs, and we had a total of 15,812 renewal applications over the past year. And the average number of business days that it takes to process a completed application, which I think is interesting, for nursing licensure is 1.2

days. So it's actually 1.2 days. We get a lot of questions and customer service issues about that, but we have been able to gather that data, and it's 1.2 days. And that's a completed application. Once everything is complete, that's how long it takes for a

person to get licensed.

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In addition, October the 5th -- this is our renewal year for RNs which started September the 1st. So, currently, as of October the 5th, there were 7,062 RN renewals as of that date. So we have a lot more RNs to renew, so we need to get busy with that. I know Tina has done an excellent job and the licensure staff in getting the word out and assisting with the renewal process.

We have made some changes to the computer system, which is our ThoughtSpan, that has also accelerated the ability of RNs to get their licenses done. They can be relicensed via their phone app.

They can go on the ThoughtSpan system. So there are a lot of avenues available out there. We tested it. It worked fine. We were able to do it. So there's no need for anybody to not be able to renew and get all of this done, and we are encouraging that they get it done prior to the end of December. So don't wait until the last particular day to get it done.

As for licensures, we have 51,263 RNs 1 licensed, 13,370 LPNs licensed. Of those, we have 2 4,633 nurse practitioners, 876 nurse anesthetists, and 3 33 nurse midwives. And the CCHTs, which are the hemodialysis technicians, we have a total of 604 of 5 So I just wanted to give you those particular figures and numbers to let you know basically the amount of licensees that we're dealing with. You seem 8 like you had a question. 9 DR. KING: Could you repeat those 10 numbers? 11 MS. JOHNSON: All of them or just the 12 advanced practice breakdown? 13 DR. KING: Okay. I'm good. Got it. 14 MS. JOHNSON: You got it? 15 DR. KING: I got it. 16 Because it should be in the MS. JOHNSON: 17 packet. I just wanted to highlight that. And the 18 other information I had was dealing with the 19 Investigative Division, but all of that is in the 20 packet, showing you the number of investigations that 21 we're doing on an actual basis. We're averaging 22 about, I think, 66 allegations per month basically. 23 So that information is in your packet as well and 24 gives you a breakdown of how many outstanding cases we 25

I think we've had over a thousand 1 investigations, investigative cases over the past 2 year, and we currently have about 400, roughly 400 3 still open, and we have completed about 600. And that was over the past year. 5 DR. STANFORD: Out of those allegations 6 you get every month, how many are legitimate? 7 MS. JOHNSON: The majority of them are legitimate. 9 DR. STANFORD: Really? 10 MS. JOHNSON: I would say that very 11 seldom do we have frivolous. Out of the ones that we 12 get, I would say about 90 to 95 percent. 13 DR. STANFORD: Really? 14 MS. JOHNSON: Right. 15 DR. STANFORD: Okay. 16 MS. JOHNSON: Because we're dealing with, 17 most of them are drug related. So, that being said, I 18 think that's enough on the annual report. As you will 19 see, the report, the Executive Director's Report, 20 these are our updates. We have our Customer Service 21 Policy, which I did put a copy on the board members --22 on the data for you. We talked about this during our 23 last board meeting, and this is something that the 24 staff came up with, and they feel real good about it.

I empowered them to come up with the customer service, 1 and we would like to make changes that we thought needed to be in there, and we would like for the Board to just make a motion to approve that so we can put it 4 with our Policy and Procedural Manual. (PAUSE) 6 MS. JOHNSON: And I must say, I have 7 gotten several comments from our stakeholders in the 8 community on how well customer service has been done 9 at the Board. 10 DR. KING: So, once we have had time to 11 review the policy, I think Phyllis is asking for a 12 motion to approve this updated Customer Service 13 Policy. So do we have a motion to approve this? 14 DR. STANFORD: I make a motion to 15 16 approve. DR. KING: Motion made by Dr. Stanford. 17 Do we have a second? 18 MS. NORRIS: I second it. 19 DR. This is a fun event, but we get a chance to go and take the NCLEX Test Review here, and it's in November, I believe, the first week in November. So several of us will get up and go and take that. It's, like, looking at the items and going through it and seeing it, you know, get a feel for what it's like, and then provide feedback to them as well.

MS. JOHNSON: Right. You know, with the next generation NCLEX, I'm kind of anxious to take this test. I may not be able to pass it, but we'll see. But I'm glad that Darlene is participating in that and highly encourage other board members. The next time it comes up, let us know. We will be happy to plug you in.

RN Renewals, as I said, that number has changed, because it's over 7,000 now, I think 7,092.

And I would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate our own board president, Dr. Melissa King. She was honored in September, the last part of September as one of the Mississippi Business Journal's 2018 Healthcare Heroes, so congratulations.

and Directors. The LPN Council, we had a great time
talking to the Council, and it was a very productive
event, I think so, and I appreciate our board member,
Sandra Culpepper, being there. As you know, Sandra is
the chair of the LPN Feasibility Committee. And so I

think it was a great opportunity to network and start that partnership with the LPN community. Also, Ms. Linda Shows, who is in the audience, was there, and we appreciate Linda and what she has done to assist with that effort as well. So, thank you, Linda.

The Go Red Breakfast and the Go Red Premier, which was last night, we're a part of that sponsorship, and we think that's very important.

We had two people that went to the NCSBN Board of Nursing Investigator Training, and we also had some staff attend FARB, which is the Federal Association of Regulatory Boards, which is always a very informative session. That being said, the FARB event that just happened was for legal people. I think our Attorney General also had an opportunity to attend that conference, so we appreciate her being a part of that.

The next FARB session will be in NOLA,

New Orleans, Louisiana, in January. I already got the
save-the-date information. We highly encourage board

members to attend. I will be sending that out with
the dates. You need to go if you haven't been. It's
a great learning opportunity. Plus, it's in New

Orleans. But it is an excellent opportunity for you

to learn, as well as staff. That is one of the ones that I highly encourage staff, as well as board members, to attend. So I'll send out more information about that.

We also attended the NCSBN Annual Meeting and the NCLEX Conference. We had Ms. Talisha Greenlaw and Ms. Alena Williams to attend that, because it's what they do on a daily basis. So it was very informative to them as well.

Upcoming Board Visibility, you mentioned the MNA Convention that Dr. King mentioned. We will be attending that. We have the American Heart Association Heart Walk in November coming up. I highly encourage board members to participate in that. We have a little competition going on around here at the Board with the staff, and they are highly engaged. So they may be approaching you before you leave today. But we would like to make a contribution to the American Heart Association, and you can be a part of that. We will have a team walking. We would like for you-all to walk with us. We will have t-shirts made, all of that. So I think it will be a good cause.

And I talked about the Symposium, that we have some board members attending. And the Executive Committee and the Finance Committee of NCSBN, we are

would like to approve this one first, if that's okay, 1 and then we will move forward with the other discussions that Phyllis was talking about. So we 3 have a motion made. I made the motion. nursing is not included. So what we would like to

do -- the thought process is to go to those Public 1 Health and Welfare Chairs and ask if we could just be 2 added to that list of providers that helps keep rural 3 access available and include nursing into that current 5 statute. MS. LINDSEY: I have a question, and if 6 it embarrasses me, I'm sorry. Have we voted on the 7 CCHTs? Was it maybe a meeting I did not attend of asking for that to be taken out of the Board of 9 Nursing's authority? Have we voted on that as a 10 board? 11 DR. KING: We did that last meeting. 12 MS. LINDSEY: Okay. I just wanted to 13 make sure. Okay. 14 MS. COLLINS: I have a question as well 15 Does the Board of Nursing do a formal 16 legislative agenda that they send out to the Governor, 17 Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House, and our 18 legislators, possibly something that we can support? 19 I mean, what is our position on that? 20 MS. JOHNSON: I don't think they have 21 done that in the past, Jan, but I can get with Trey, 22 and, certainly, if it's the board's wishes, we can do 23 that. 24 MS. COLLINS: Well, if it's something we 25

can show unified effort, you know, between the board,
if we voted on it, I think it would probably be good.

Trey would be the perfect person.

MS. JOHNSON: Right. And I can discuss that with him and get back with the board if you would like for me to do that.

DR. KING: Thanks, Jan. And we will do -- I guess Trey will present that maybe at our next board meeting.

MS. JOHNSON: Either that, or we can call a special meeting, if you would like, and we can discuss it at that time.

pr. KING: Thank you. The last thing from the Executive Committee is the MOU/MOA between the Mississippi Community College Board and the Mississippi Board of Nursing for the LPN Transition, Feasibility Transition which was passed. And everyone has a copy on the board of the changes that have been made to the MOU, which if passed here today, would then be sent to the Mississippi Community College Board for their review to bring back to us for any kind of final approval. If they make any changes or addendum to that one, then we would rediscuss it again in December. So take time to read over that so that we can -- we will need a motion to approve the current

And, lastly, we have developed goals for our upcoming year. The purpose of our Advanced Practice Committee is that it is a longstanding committee and is charged with addressing and clarifying the scope of practice issues for advanced practice registered nurses or APRNs throughout the state. Therefore, our goals for the upcoming year will be, number 1, to recognize emerging technology, such as telemedicine, to aid in defining "scope of practice" as questions and requests for procedures are made by APRNs.

Second goal: Include evidence-based practice and deliberations involving requests and questions regarding scope of practice.

Number 3: Require all inquiries to committees be prefaced with written details, to include proposed policies, procedural details, and education that is in place and will be utilized.

And, lastly, develop a decision tree to be utilized by the requesting APRN that should be included for all scope of practice requests in an effort to place more responsibility on the requesting APRN and to streamline the procedure for the committee.

DR. KING: Thank you, Dr. Stanford. I

think we have our work cut out for us in that committee as well. I appreciate you doing that. I think all of the chairs of each committee have actually worked really hard with their liaison on the staff to help with setting goals and strategies to accomplish certain things. So I really appreciate that. Okay. So that brings us to the Practice Committee, Ms. Shirley Jackson.

Ms. JACKSON: Good morning, everyone.

Madam Chair, I have one motion to bring forward.

WARD: 12 the chairman of the Administrative Code Ad Hoc 13 Committee, the Board of Nursing Administrative Code 14 Committee is very active. It is up to the 15 Administrative Code Committee to develop rules and 1.6 regulations to keep up with the ever changing field of 17 nursing. The primary focus of the committee is to 18 complete and present updates to the Administrative 19 Code to the full board. 20 The sections reviewed over the last 12 21 months include Part 2815, Continuing Education. 22 proposed rule was submitted August -- passed the full 23 board and was submitted to the Secretary of State 2.4 August 16th, 2018. Included in this update, it would

be established, if passed, mandatory continuing education for all nurses.

Part 2830, the Practice of Nursing, this section became effective November 1st, 2017. However, there was an update to this rule submitted on August 16th, 2018.

Part 2840, Advanced Practice, this section was reviewed, presented, and became effective July 29th, 2017. However, there was also a new proposed rule submitted on August 24th, 2018.

Included in this update was prescribing of controlled substances which were based on the Governor's Opioid Task Force Recommendations.

The goals for the next year are many.

However, they include review and updates for Part

2825, Rules of Procedure. We would like to see this scheduled for a vote in December of 2018. This is regarding legal procedures, legal process to bolster the restoration section and others.

Part 2810, Examinations and Licensure, there was discussion proposed May 10th, 2017.

However, no final rule was proposed.

Part 2820, Denial, Revocation, Suspension of License, there was discussion proposed on May 10th, 2017. However, no final rule was proposed at that

1 time.

Part 2860, Certified Clinical Hemodialysis Technicians, is up for review.

Part 2870, Definitions, there was some discussion proposed June 20th, 2017. However, it was determined that further work was needed as well.

And the final section was Part 2880, which is Fees. Nothing has been proposed yet.

However, the fee schedules have been looked at.

The additional challenges of the committee over the next year will include advanced practice certification updates, reviewing those certifications, and to determine what, if any, rules will need to be added to the Administrative Code.

Secondly, establishing telehealth regulations for all nurses. And I would like to have the next committee meeting scheduled for November.

That would be ahead of our next December Full Board Meeting. So I will be proposing that to the committee shortly.

DR. KING: Thanks, Blake. I appreciate all your hard work. I know those are long meetings, and there's a lot done in those. So, thank you for that. The next -- that brings us to the LPN Transition Feasibility Committee, Ms. Sandra.

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MS. CULPEPPER: Thank you, Dr. King.

This past year we worked very diligently within our committee to research the transfer of the LPN programs in the State of Mississippi to the Board of Nursing. After much work through our committee, legislation was passed to transfer them in April. And I apologize for missing the last meeting, but my mom is doing better, not great, but she's better. But, Dr. King, thank you very much for handling that for us. I truly appreciate it. But I heard and understand from the minutes that there was a lot of hard work done with And at this point we would like to move forward with Dr. King bringing out of Executive Committee the MOU, as well as continuing to start on the Administrative Code part of the transfer for the LPN programs.

that that was hard. I do want to bring attention to, the committee did a ton of work and got us to where we needed to be, along with the staff doing their research and all of that. So, with that and with the LPN -- it was an LPN Feasibility Committee. With the passage and signage and implementation of the statute, House Bill 721, that committee specifically will be dissolved, because the charge has been complete of

identifying if it was feasible to come up under the Board of Nursing. And, with that, we will be establishing a separate ad hoc advisory committee to discuss implementation and advise on rules and regulations to the Administrative Code Committee on how that needs to be developed further. So, thank you.

MS. CULPEPPER: Thank you, Dr. King.

DR. KING: The next one is the Emergency Practice and Standards Advisory Committee that we have within the Board, and so we have made some significant progress this year and have a lot more ahead of us. But we have defined exactly what "emergency" is. We have adopted the recommendations from national organizations on the education, training, and competency of nurses in those emergency settings, and we also discussed the management of IV moderate sedation, and it was amended to have the definition of "emergency" in that, in the event that the emergency nurses were having to assist and manage those medications.

For the next year, we will be moving toward more of an APRN and tele-emergency and telehealth. I know that there's a common theme here, and it's no secret that telehealth is my passion.

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However, it's where healthcare is moving and where we're going. And so I think that is going to be a part of every committee's charge is kind of assisting and helping get us up to speed of where we should be with telehealth. So that is what's on the agenda for the Emergency Practice and Standards until we get other questions and something else arises.

personal statement before I start, when I grew up, my mother told me, she said I can do anything I want to do if I work hard enough. So that is the beauty of ONW. If we work hard enough, we do not have any limits to where this group within the Board of Nursing can go and how we can help the nurses in the workforce in Mississippi. later, you will see how we have addressed all of 1 I'm not going to bring up the APRNs yet, because the need assessment has not been completed, 3 but they will have a component that will also be addressed there. I wanted to thank my committee 5 members. I know the other ones didn't, but I want to 6

really thank mine, not that I'm the best chair.

MS. LINDSEY: The reason I want to do that is because we were not authorized by the president or charged until July. And so we did a lot of work in a short period of time with the help of staff. Shirley Jackson, Nancy Norris, and Alton Shaw, thank y'all so much. They got tired of seeing my name on their phone. I will truly believe that.

We have been very active in terms of revising different forms in ONW. I want to thank Ms. Jones. She has been such a trooper here in the last couple of months. We talk pretty -- a lot, don't we? We talk a lot. I do want to say that we do have two motions coming out of the committee, and the first motion is related to the LPN program.

MR. SHAW: The motion we have is: Π" move that the Board adopt the Office of Nursing Workforce Ad Hoc Committee's recommendation to approve

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funding within Fiscal Year 2019, not to exceed \$100,000, for Simulation Training for Mississippi Licensed Practical Nursing faculty to be provided by the Mississippi Academy for Simulation Training Program at the University of Mississippi Medical Center."
